Who Does What?

- Model what it means to be a humble, submitted, growing, honest, bold, and passionate follower of Jesus Christ. Focus on growing in Christ myself and building good relationships with the children and their families. Contribute to the Sunday School ministry with my gifts and talents.

EXPECTATIONS

The Two Greatest:

#1 Always be growing in your relationship with Jesus Christ. (Love God)

#2 Invest in the lives of the children you work with. (Love others)

The Details:

- Spend regular time with God in His Word and in prayer
- Participate in one worship service **every** Sunday morning
- Be in some group for your own support and learning
- Honor your family and close relationships
- Seek out accountability and counsel in your walk with God
- Use your gifts joyfully and generously
- Work faithfully and diligently **with** your teaching partner if you have one
- Arrive in the classroom 20-10 minutes early to greet students every Sunday
- Make sure students on First floor (NTP-2nd grade) leave room with approved parent/guardian
- Keep attendance records and make sure every student is registered
- Prepare for your lessons—know the story, gather supplies, etc.
- Let Tracee know when you will be absent (Please do not invite someone to teach in your classroom without talking to Tracee or other CDMT member about it first.)
- Be a good role model at Church, and in all of life (Children see you, and look up to you, other places too!)
- Set an example to the children in your dress, your speech, and your participation
- Learn the names of your students and greet them outside of Sunday School
- Attend Shepherd's Huddle Meetings once a quarter
- Help Tracee to get to know you (she's terrible at small talk), and help her keep her focus on people not programs—it's about relationships! Make Tracee aware of things we need to change and problems that are occurring. Please pray for her and her work with the Sunday School.
